# **MUCH BIRCH PARISH COUNCIL**

#### Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting of Much Birch Parish Council held at the Much Birch Community Hall on Thursday 6th February 2025 from 7.30 pm

#### **Open Session:-**

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. There were no further comments during the Open Session.

#### 1.0 Apologies for Absence

There were apologies for absence received from Cllr Chris Pickering Grey and Cllr David Irwin (also Footpath Officer)

#### 2.0 Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest made.

#### 3.0 Minutes of previous meeting

The Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting, held at the Much Birch Community Hall on the 9<sup>th</sup> January 2025, were approved as a true and correct record of the Meeting.

#### 4.0 <u>Reports</u>

#### 4.1) P.C.S.O. from West Mercia Police

Golden Valley Briefing - Newsletter circulated when received.

**4.2) Ward Councillor** Ward Cllr Toni Fagan was in attendance at the meeting. The Ward Cllr advised that the roads were in a "nightmare situation". Laskett Lane was in a bad state and was being used as a cut through as the Hoarwithy Road was closed due to a landslip. The Ward Cllr was in contact with Ed Bradford the Herefordshire Council Head of Highways in relation to the difficulties being experienced with all manner of traffic taking diversions. The Ward Cllr said that the road at Wormelow was "horrendous". Drainage grants were available and the parish council was meeting with the Lengthsman to discuss the options.

The Shire Hall Planning was going ahead.

There would be free parking in Hereford City on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> February from 12 noon. There would be a Herefordshire Council Budget Meeting held on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> February 2025. There were "huge demands" on every income stream. Council Tax would be going up by 4.99%. The Government had decided not to pay the Rural Services Grant. This would lead to more challenges.

The five year land supply was out of date and running at 3.6 years due to new housing targets. The Ward Cllr said that "speculative developments were more likely to go ahead and that this may impact on Neighbourhood Development Plans."

The Council were waiting for updates on the Devolution proposals which may see amalgamation with Worcestershire for some service provision and a "Mayoral level" of governance being introduced.

The Ward Cllr left the meeting at 7.44 pm.

### 4.3) Locality Steward

The parish council were awaiting details of the new Locality Steward. The Members Monthly Update had been received and also street works updates from Balfour Beatty.

#### **Verge Cutting options**

Information had been received on options for verge cutting, and it was decided, by the parish council, that the verges would be cut as would normally carried out, i.e. two cuts per annum to help preserve visibility at the splays and junctions.

The parish council discussed planning consultation number 230231 and resolved to continue to object to the proposals due to the previously communicated concerns and with the reiteration of concerns over drainage, impact on ecological habitat and wetland plus access and exit highway safety.

The Clerk would ask for an extension to the deadline for comments on the Helenswood Farm amended consultation number 243018.
