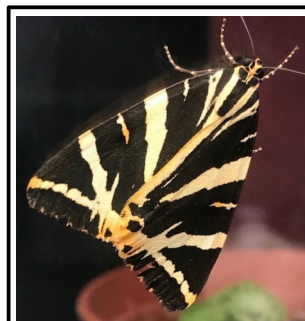
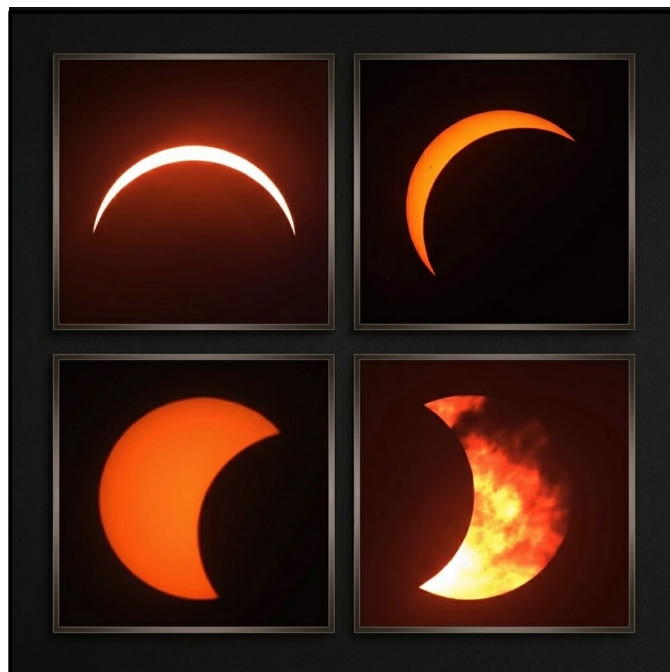

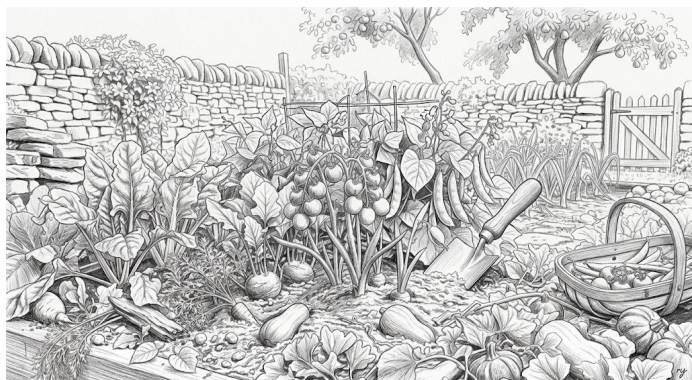

Jobs for the garden in September



What a couple of months! July and August have seen records broken again. Take a look at our gardens and the fields at present. I started my September 2022 article with the last three sentences and here we are in the same state with June added to it. We all crave for warm summers but have had it with a vengeance. Walking on grass creates the same sound as walking on a gravel path. Flowers, shrubs and vegetables look very sorry for themselves and in respect of vegetables it goes without saying that shortages and inferior quality will be evident this autumn and winter. With reducing daylight hours and cooler temperatures very little can be planted to compensate. If, as suggested, this type of weather is going to become the norm, we may have to think about different sowing/planting regimes from those that we are accustomed to. I read recently that it has been suggested that it might be worth reverting back to growing heritage vegetables as opposed to the F1 varieties, as they may be more resilient. Who knows?

- Clean greenhouse and cold frame glass.
- Plant new perennials towards the end of the month.
- Water greenhouse plants in the morning now so plants don't spend all night sitting in cold water.
- Move house plants to a lighter position and reduce watering.
- Bulbs – Daffodil, Scilla, Crocus and Hyacinths can be planted in borders and pots.
- Reseed patches of bare lawn.
- Keep dead heading flowers
- Harvest Apples and Pears – store unblemished fruits, with stalk intact in single layers, not touching, in a cool, dark, frost free and well ventilated location.
- Plant Autumn onion sets.
- Sow small quantities of salad leaves and Radishes.
- Consider Tomato Chutney to use up the green fruits. They can also be stored in boxes in a cool location and brought out to ripen as required.
- If you are lucky enough to have visits from Hedgehogs, put out a little dog or cat food.
- Clean nesting boxes, line with straw or wood shavings and rehang them.
- Put a net over ponds to prevent leaves falling in.

An article from Revd. Mark : What has Theology ever done for us?

Hi everyone.

When I was at Theological College just outside Oxford, doing my training to become a minister in the Church of England, I, somewhat speciously asked the above question. There were two types of answer.

Firstly, those who had done theology as their first degree or read up on it more deeply than I were keen to point out that it helps explain the world as it is and as it will become at the end of time. They would talk to great effect about God, his redemptive love for all creation and how it was a logical explanation to all those great questions we struggled with when pondering our place in the universe.

Second, those who had studied at the University of Life (i.e. not Oxbridge), said that it was a useful adjunct to their lived experience of God's love in their lives and so helped them with making sense of the world.

I have to say that I see both points of view. Yes, we need some deep questioning and thinking about God – even if we come to the conclusion that there isn't one – but we also need to reflect on how our lives, in all their messiness and complexity, have some sort of meaning and we are not just screaming into the void.

So, while theology can seem to be some ivory-tower luxury for those who have the time and the intellectual capacity to ponder such things, there is still a place for it in everyday life. I want to point to two examples. The first is from Pope Leo XIV on Artificial Intelligence. Now, whether you agree with the Roman Catholic church or not, this is a great document, reminding us that, no matter how wonderful and enticing the dream of technology is, it is nothing if it doesn't serve the common good. The second is from The Church of England House of Bishops and is called "Hope for All Creation". I am just starting to study it, but so far I am impressed with its thinking regarding the current environmental crisis. And, even if you have no faith, both of these documents offer up a significant challenge to how we live now and how we might live in the future.

So far from theology being relegated to the sidelines, here are two documents worth reading. Not only that, both are free! So download each one, if you want, and have a read and a think!

PARISH MEETING – at the Much Birch Parish Council Meeting held in the Much Birch Community Hall on the 2nd July 2026 from 7.30 pm.

The meeting discussed the ongoing issues with the much needed resurfacing of Tump Lane, where the road was broken up in a large number of places. It was hoped that the surface repairs would be carried out in the near future. There were some ongoing enquiries, being made by the Ward Councillor, concerning the play area in Tump Lane and also the grass cutting contract. The parish council were looking at further improvements to be made to the public rights of way network and would be bidding for grant funding to assist with the projects. There were no further planning applications for consideration within the parish.

The next ordinary Parish Council Meeting of the Much Birch Parish Council will be held on Thursday 3rd September 2026 from 7.30pm at the Much Birch Community Hall. All are welcome to attend.

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Summer Turns the Corner in The Birches

There is a subtle shift in the air across The Birches as late August has arrived. The long, sun-baked afternoons are gradually yielding to crisp, misty mornings over the Wye Valley, signalling that early autumn is just around the corner. This season's backdrop, however, has been remarkably dry. Herefordshire has experienced one of its driest summers in recent memory, following a historic July that delivered less than 10% of our usual rainfall. The parched soils have left local pasture baked brown and garden beds thirsty, making any passing shower a welcome sight. Yet out along the parish lanes, nature remains remarkably resilient. Deep-rooted hedgerows are bursting with wild fruit—heavy clusters of blackberries, elderberries, and bright red rosehips line the tracks toward Aconbury Hill. Swallows and house martins are gathering in growing numbers, holding noisy family summits before their long journey south. It's a rewarding, transitional time in our corner of the county—a brief window to enjoy the tail-end of summer while watching the landscape quietly gather itself for the seasonal turn.

This month I would like to highlight an author rather than an individual book i.e. Joanna Trollope. She died last December and I was inspired to re-read some of her books.

In the past she has been unfavourably compared with her famous ancestor Antony Trollope and her novels have been described as "Aga sagas". Terence Blacker who coined the phrase, admitted a decade later that he "felt terribly" for lumbering Trollope with the phrase which seemed to stick.

However, when I re-read three of her books : A Village Affair, A Passionate Man, and The Rector's Wife I was struck by how good they were. She really understands human nature and how people relate to one another. Her characters are so believable and you really care what happens to them.

Pilates is a great way to keep your body feeling agile and energised. The movements focus on posture, alignment, core strength balance and flexibility.



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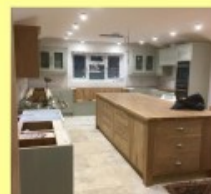


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Mel's Musings

I love this time of year. Why, well mainly because I thoroughly enjoy picking my own produce, eating it and also preparing it for the winter by either drying, freezing or bottling. I particularly enjoy making big trays of Ratatouille from my own onions, courgettes and tomatoes all chopped up, seasoned with salt and pepper and generous dabs of crushed garlic and butter and cooked in the oven for around half an hour or until the courgettes are cooked. I then pack them into individual portion plastic pots I have saved from desserts I have bought, and then freeze for use in the heart of winter as a quick vegetable accompaniment with a meat or fish dish.

I love courgettes and always grow lots, not only to make the above ratatouille but also I grate them and freeze them to put in with all my curries, stews and soup dishes. They make a delicious courgette, cheese and potato soup, which is a favourite and easy to make.

Here's the recipe for courgette, cheese and potato soup:

500g potatoes, peeled and chopped;
2 stock cubes;
1kg courgettes, roughly chopped;
bunch spring onions
100g mature cheese – grated.

Cook potatoes in enough water just to cover, along with the stock cubes, simmer for 5 mins once brought to the boil then add courgettes and cook until nearly tender. Add spring onions, chopped, and cook until all tender (around another 5 mins). Turn off heat and add cheese and then blitz. Add more water, if needed, at this stage and also season to suit taste. Freezes well.



Courgettes are also most glorious if gently fried in butter, when they start to caramelise and taste so very sweet. You can grate them and make courgette bread or courgette cake, a remarkably moorish and moist alternative to carrot cake.

For a change what about **courgette fritters** made from squeezed out, grated courgettes mixed with a basic batter, with some finely chopped onion or spring onion, garlic and salt and pepper. Fry in tablespoon sized portions until crispy on both sides. Finally try courgette and sweetcorn relish or just basic courgette chutney. I am just finishing my very last jar of chutney I made in August 2021, so will have to make some more this year. Anyway, please don't dismiss this wonderful vegetable, just remember to pick it before it get bigger than 6" then it will be in its best condition. No peeling required and will keep in the fridge for at least a week with no deterioration.
